Shooters/Markers Procedures for Short Siberia During the Covid 19 Restrictions

If you are feeling unwell or have Covid 19 symptoms please do not visit the National Shooting Centre, no matter how mild the symptoms. If you are displaying symptoms yourself you must isolate for 7 days. If you are sharing a household with someone who is displaying symptoms you must isolate for 14 days.

Existing precautions, you should:

- Wash your hands regularly (Sanitiser units will be available on the ranges and at key points around the site).
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue (Catch it, Bin it, Kill it)
- Sanitise surfaces and equipment that are touched/handled regularly.
- Comply with National Shooting Centre Range Regulations.

1. The National Shooting Centre is progressing through a route map, incrementally introducing additional ranges and targetry. Short Siberia range will open on Friday 19th June 2020. Standard “pin on” targetry will be used in conjunction with the cantilever frames. Targets can be “marked” by target markers.

2. In order to ensure that markers, shooters and NSC staff remain safe the following procedure is to be adhered to:

- a. All Shooters with bookings on Short Siberia should report directly to Short Siberia range. Lane allocation will be displayed at the gate.
- b. Shooting will only be permitted on alternate lanes.
- c. The NSC will provide a Butts Officer who is responsible for all activity in the Butts. All target markers will come under the Butts Officer’s command and must follow their direction.
- d. All shooting will be conducted in details under control of the NSC.



- e. Each detail will last 45mins after which there will be a cease fire for 15mins, during this time markers may changeover and targetry can be patched/replaced by shooters without a marker.
- f. Population of, and exit from, the Butts will be controlled by NSC staff.
- g. Once on their target the markers will not be permitted to move around the Markers' Gallery.
- h. Shooting without a marker will be permitted however access to the Butts, to replace/change targetry, will be prohibited except for during the ceasefire periods.
- i. The firing point will be run by an NSC appointed RO
- j. NSC staff will wipe down target frames and hand rails prior to shooting
- k. On arrival at the allocated target frame the marker/shooter must wipe down with the wipes provided. Protective gloves will be available in the Butts.

There are 4 x access points to the markers gallery, Markers and shooters changing targets are to enter the gallery via the point nearest their target.

Routine

Entrance

3. 0800 - 0815:

Shooters that do not have a marker are to have affixed their targetry, below the TCH, before 0815

4. At 0815:

Shooter affixing targets are to be clear of the butts

Target markers move into the Butts

5. At 0830:



Shooting Commences

6. At 0915:

Ceasefire – markers exit the Butts. Shooters without markers access their targetry and exit asap.
Markers move into the Butts

7. At 0930:

Shooting recommences

8. At 1015:

Ceasefire – markers exit the Butts. Shooters without markers access their targetry and exit asap.
Markers move into the Butts

9. 1300 - 1315:

Shooters that do not have a marker are to have affixed their targetry, below the TCH, before 1315

The procedure described above will repeat throughout the day with 45 min details
