Collapse of Mantlet	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Range Inspection regime monthly/annually/Weekly • Signs of attrition from bullet strike are reported in the range inspections to be repaired • Signs of environmental degradation will be raised in the range inspection for repair • Any signs if structural degradation then access will be restricted to only NRA and third party contractor staff 	L	H	Medium
Contact with electricity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All installation on electrical services are carried out by NRA qualified electricians or electronic target teams • Electrical installations subject to inspection regime 	L	H	Medium
Crushing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All NRA employed target markers must pass a competency test prior to being employed • All NRA employed target markers are trained in the use of butt facilities • Butt Supervisors/NRA staff monitor the use of Hythe frames • Target frames should be correctly counter balanced 	M	M	Medium
Cuts/abrasions/lacerations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Markers receive induction training on the hazard and risks of the butts • 1st aid point located in the butts for minor injuries • NRA qualified on hand to assist in on site first aid or direct emergency services through NRA radio procedure via range control 	M	L	Low
Fire	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No smoking policy in the butts which is to be enforced by the butts supervisor and NRA staff • Markers or Butt Supervisors to inform immediately range control via radio of any sign of fire smoke and evacuate through the proven route out of the butts 	M	L	Low
Mental/Physical Fatigue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Markers are given an unpaid 60 minute break if they have worked more than six hours in one day 	M	L	Low

Access/Egress	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All access gates are padlocked with keys strictly controlled • MOD conduct a perimeter check and range clearance run at least 3 times per week to ensure integrity of the perimeter fence • Perimeter fence topped with razor wire encloses the RDA • Access to the RDA must be approved by Range Control/Safety Staff • Range Control liaises with Pirbright RC when MOD ranges are live • Markers can gain access to Century butts via Hobson's way using vehicles or by the markers walkway on foot 	L	M	Low
Slips/trips	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees/Staff • Young Persons • Temporary Workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Markers and Butt Supervisors to ensure good standard of housekeeping • All Markers undergo induction training prior to be allowed in the butts • Butts are inspected weekly by range staff and daily during competitions • Butt supervisors appointed to control activity • Range area access controlled no unauthorised access outside shooting times unless specifically stated • No access outside shooting times or low light conditions 	M	M	Medium
