CERTIFICATION - From 1st January 2009, every civilian shooting on a MoD range must carry a Shooter Certification Card (SCC) signed by the chairman of a club, which is affiliated to the NRA, and of which he/she is a member. Competitors must produce this certificate before being allowed to shoot. Full details on this subject can be found on the NRA website.

DECLARATION - This MUST be signed by all competitors. I declare that:

- ${\bf 1.\ I\ am\ not\ a\ prohibited\ person\ within\ the\ meaning\ of\ Section\ 21\ Firearms\ Act\ 1968\ (as\ amended).}$
- 2. I have never had a Firearm or Shotgun Certificate refused or revoked. (If you have, please enclose full details in a sealed envelope marked 'Confidential').
- 3. On the first day of the competition I will be aged fourteen years or over.
- 4. I meet at least one of the following conditions:
- a. I hold a Firearm Certificate permitting me to use the firearms that I shall fire in this competition for target shooting.
- b. I am a full member of a Home Office Approved Club, will be shooting as a full member of that club and will use any firearm for which I do not hold a Firearm Certificate only in accordance with the applicable exemptions to S1 Firearms Act 1968 as amended.
- 5. I agree that results and classifications may be published on the internet or elsewhere. (Please note that only your name, competitor number, class and score will be posted)
- 6. I agree to abide by the rules of the National Rifle Association and of the Meeting and I will accept the decisions of the Meeting Director and the

Committee as final.

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#### Notes: See CSR &PR Handbook for Match Conditions

- **1a** Competitors may enter these matches in one of the following classes:
  - i Historic, Any SMLE, No 4, No 5 service pattern rifle, with as issued 1937 pattern sling.
  - ii Any Iron. Any rifle with Iron Sights, with no restriction on slings, rests may not be used. Min trigger weight 4.5lbs.
- iii Service Optic. Any rifle with Optic sights, with a max power of 4.5X and a min trigger weight of 4.5lbs. With no restriction on slings. Rests may **not** be used. The rifle may touch or rest on the forearm or on the ground. Any vertical or Angled Fore Grip (AFG) may be used but must remain fitted at all times.
- iv Practical Optic. Any rifle with Optic sights with no restriction on slings or rests. If any rest is used it must remain fitted to the rifle at all times during the match. Min trigger weight 1.5kg.
- **1b** This entry form, together with payment (see section 3 below) must be returned to Shooting Division, no later than 5pm on Thursday 28th June 2018. Receipt of Entry Form will only be sent in email form.
- 1c Register cards will be issued by the NRA from the Front Counter and will be available for collection from 14.00 Tuesday 3 July 2018.
- 1d These matches will be fired between Wednesday 4 July and Saturday 7 July 2018. The match conditions can be found in the CSR & PR Handbook. The Civilian Methuen Match will be shot on Sunday 8 July 2018 and a separate entry form is available to download from the NRA website.

#### **Prizes**

- Prizes will be Prize List D (see Bisley Bible, Appendix XIII) and will be awarded in each of the four classes. Trophies will be awarded to the winners, in each of the four classes of the Civilian Service Rifle Championship.
- **2b** All medals and bars will be forwarded, by post, after the meeting to the address given overleaf by the competitor. This address must be completed in full.

#### **Declaration**

#### Classes

5 The class of entry will be determined solely by the class of rifle being used as in 1a above.

#### **Butt Marking and Range Duties**

It is a condition of entry that all competitors must be prepared to butt mark or do other range duties as, required, during this meeting. Other than in the Falling Plates, all competitors will generally shoot and mark 'turn about'. Please note that 'buying out' will **not** be possible for the service rifle events during these days. It will therefore not be possible to shoot with two classes of rifle. All matches are unsquadded.
