Airguns are permitted.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maximum Muzzle Velocity: 655 m/s (2150 ft/s) • Maximum Muzzle Energy: 2030 J (1496 ft lb) <p>Special Requirements (permission required):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small bore target rifles prone or 3 position shooting. • Firearms exceeding GR ME and/or MV may be permitted in exceptional circumstances with prior written permission from the CE • Cannon <p>Not Permitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 22 Hornet • .17 HMR
RANGE SAFETY LIMITATIONS	
Coordinating Instructions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Shooting on this range affects the following ranges: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Stickledown b. Butt Zero c. BSRC 2. Access: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. All shooting must cease to allow access to/from Stickledown Butts. 3. Range infrastructure is not to be used as targetry or to zero/check zero firearms. 4. Fire and movement is not permitted on Melville. <p>Bay A</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. 3 x targets may be pre-booked online, 4 x targets will be retained for “walk in” shooters. 6. Shooters are only to engage single targets and are not to cross

	<p>lane shoot at a second target.</p> <p>7. Targets are not to be engaged after passing the trip lever.</p> <p>Bays B - E</p> <p>8. A Suitably Qualified Experience Person (SQEP) is to be appointed as the responsible RO when shooting.</p> <p>9. Shooters are to move forward to the 25m firing point to shoot at that distance, targets are not to be located on the 25m firing point.</p> <p>10. When firing from 50m, the 25m firing point is to be clear of all ricochet inducing material.</p>
Firing Positions	<p>11. Positions Permitted:</p> <p>a. Bay A: Standing or Benched</p> <p>b. Bays B-E: Sitting, kneeling, standing, benched</p> <p>12. Permission to fire from any other position, or use a muzzle brake, must be notified in the booking request and granted by the Range Office in order to allow suitable target allocation on the range.</p> <p>13. Changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice providing all firers follow the same sequence.</p>
Targetry	<p>14. MAX TCH: 1.5m</p> <p>15. Unless prior permission has been obtained from the CE only targets from the NRA approved set may be used.</p> <p>16. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and /or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified, in writing, and approved by the Head of Range Services.</p> <p>17. Falling plates or other hard targets may not be engaged within Melville Range</p> <p>18. Clay pigeons are not to be engaged within Melville Range</p>
