Name	Short Siberia Range
Description	<p>Type: Gallery Range</p> <p>Danger area: Limited Danger Area (LDA) / Full Danger Area (FDA) for police use</p> <p>Distance: 5m – 200yds</p> <p>Targets:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 27 lanes at 100yds • 9 lanes at 200yds (19-27) • McQueens Castles can be fitted on Lanes 20/21, 23/24 and 26/27 • 28 target turners (4x banks of 7) at 5m – 50m • 12 target turners (2x banks of 6) at 5m – 20m <p>Additional notes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lanes 1 – 4 are undercover and have 2x fixed benches per lane. • Lane 5 is undercover and has a single fixed bench.
FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION	
Permitted firearms and ammunition including ME & MV	<p>Type: Rifles; gallery rifles, shotguns and pistols by special arrangement only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maximum Muzzle Velocity: 1000 m/s (3280 ft/s) • Maximum Muzzle Energy: 4500 J (3319 ft/lb) • HME Permitted: 4500J – 7000J HME procedures apply
RANGE SAFETY LIMITATIONS	
Coordinating Instructions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Shooting on this range affects the following ranges: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Stickledown b. Century 2. Access: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. The Butts are to be accessed via the Target Shed Road passage. Over the mantlet is not permitted. b. All firers must access the 200yd firing point from the car park, passage across the range floor is not permitted c. All shooting must cease (excluding civil police) to allow access to/from Stickledown Butts. d. Civil police are only allowed to shoot from a maximum distance of 40m with rifles and 14m with pistols where access to Stickledown is required or stop butt maintenance is occurring. 3. Vehicles are not permitted on the range floor. 4. Fire with movement is not permitted.

	<p>5. When shooting target shotgun at the left hand turning targets the relevant butt target frames are to be removed from the cantilever frames.</p> <p>6. Muzzle brakes are not permitted on the covered firing points at 100x</p>
Firing Positions	<p>7. All firing is to be conducted from the left of pegs.</p> <p>8. Positions Permitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Prone b. Supine c. Sitting d. Kneeling e. Standing f. Benched <p>9. Permission to fire from any position other than prone/supine, or use a muzzle brake, must be notified in the booking request and granted by the Range Office in order to allow suitable target allocation on the range.</p>
Targetry	<p>10. Unless prior permission has been obtained from the CE only targets from the NRA approved set may be used.</p> <p>11. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and /or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified, in writing, and approved by the Head of Range Services.</p> <p>12. Handheld targets are only to be exposed in or in front of target frames.</p> <p>13. Laterally moving targets are not permitted on Gallery ranges.</p> <p>14. Falling plates or other hard targets may not be engaged at a distance of less than 25yds (22 metres) without the permission of the CE.</p>
